Subject- Protocol to all the notified laboratories to reinforce the prescribed method for fortificants testing.

In view of the Rice fortification initiatives taken by of DFPD. Ministry of Consumer Affairs, Food and Public Distribution to review the progress of the implementation of rice fortification the following instructions communicated to all the notified labs, which involves in testing of fortified rice

Homogenization of sample - The entire sample received by the laboratory must be grinded to make it homogenous before weighing the sample for analysis to prevent the variation in results. Some of the fortificant's to be analyzed in ppb level, for e.g. Vitamin B12 which is 0.75 mcg per Kg of Rice. It is therefore the laboratory to ensure the adequate homogeneity achieved prior to take up samples analysis of micro nutrients in the fortified rice.

Intermediate checks of CRMs - The laboratory should ensure the periodical testing of prepared certified reference materials to verify their potency, stability and necessary records of those verification should be maintained. The Lab should ensure the storage of CRMs as per the supplier recommendation's / MSDS.

Reminant Samples - The lab should preserve the remaining quantity of tested sample (fully powdered) for at least 3 month from the date of reporting in a 5 to 10°C in refrigeration.

Re-testing in case of complaints - If any complaints raised against the laboratory, the control samples should be retrieved from the lab which was tested initially and re-tested in another FSSAI notified NABL accredited laboratories.

This issues with the approval of competent Authority.

Ministry of Finance Exchange Rate Notification No. 39/2023 - Customs (N.T.)

In exercise of the powers conferred by section 14 of the Customs Act, 1962 (52 of 1962), and in supersession of the Notification No. 36/2023-Customs (N.T.), dated 18th May, 2023 except as respects things done or omitted to be done before such supersession, the Central Board of Indirect Taxes and Customs hereby determines that the rate of exchange of conversion of each of the foreign currencies specified in column (2) of each of Schedule I and Schedule II annexed hereto, into Indian currency or vice versa, shall, with effect from 2nd June, 2023, be the rate mentioned against it in the corresponding entry in column (3) thereof, for the purpose of the said section, relating to imported and export goods.


