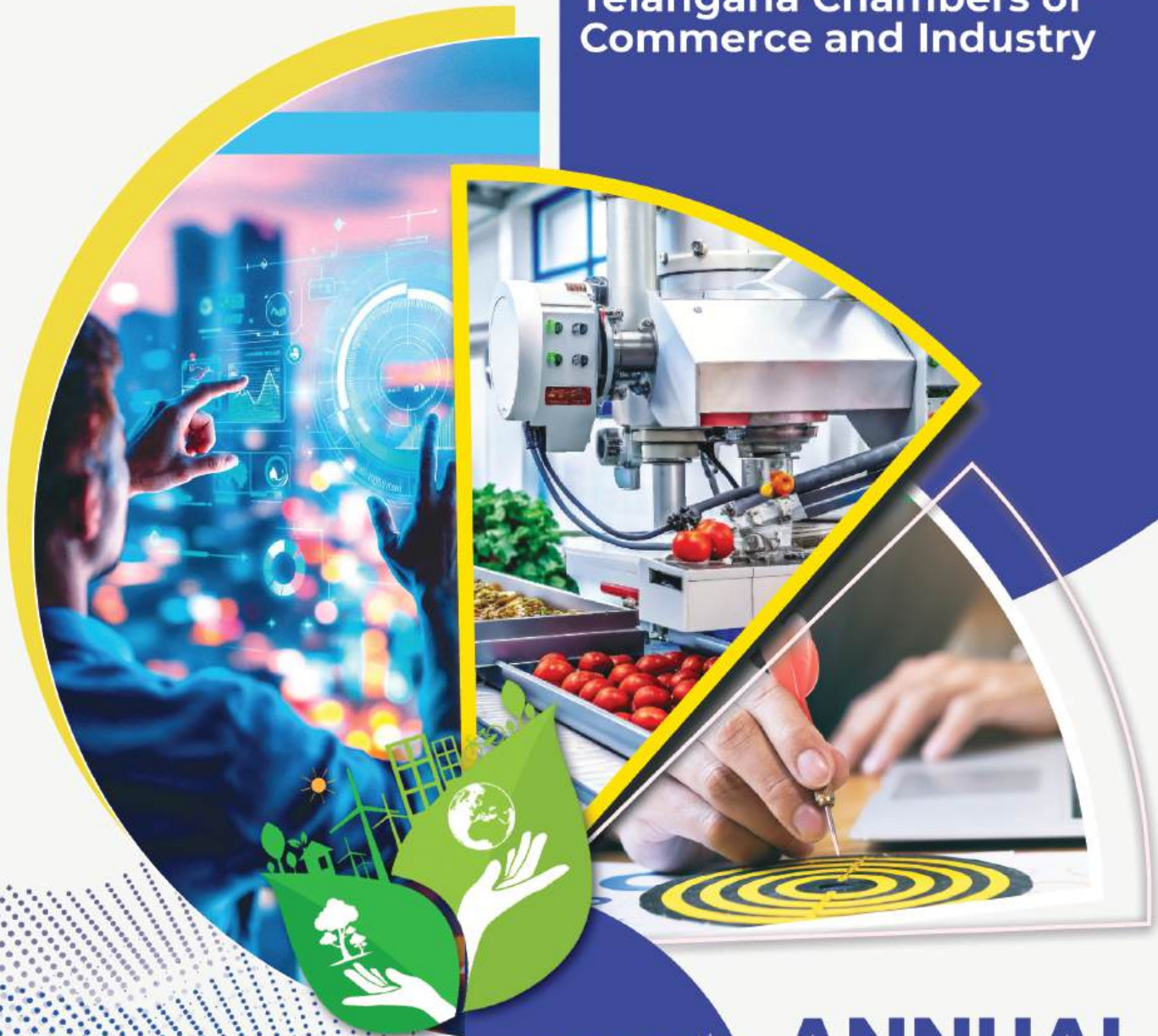

PRESIDENT *Message*



Dear FTCClates,

With immense pleasure and honour, I am presenting the 109th Annual Report of the Federation along with Annual Accounts and the Auditor's Report for the year 2025-2026.

It is a great experience to serve as the Office Bearer of one of the oldest institutions in the country. It gave me an opportunity to meet people, my co-industry members, government officials, students and interact with policy makers, intellectuals, aspiring entrepreneurs, start-ups; providing me with a learning platform. The Federation's stewardship in addressing challenges faced by industry and developing business friendly policies have yielded results, benefitting the industry in the state.

MSMEs are the pillar of economic growth in any economy, be it developed or developing. They contribute enormously to the socio-economic development of the country. Telangana state government, recognizing the importance, announced a separate policy for MSMEs and positioned the development of this sector as a catalyst for job creation. The activities of Federation are also mainly aimed towards empowering and strengthening MSME sector through policy advocacy and championing their causes.

I am proud to share with you all that the programs conducted by Federation during the year received wide appreciation for their chosen subjects, the expert speakers and the overall impact of the program. Similarly, the interactive meetings with officials of office of the Principal Accountant General (Audit); officials of RBI gave the Federation an opportunity to contribute to furthering ease of doing business in the state.

There were serious issues that affected the LT and HT industry due to changes in electricity billing system, open access restrictions, power quality requirements and issues related to renewable energy adaption. The interactive meeting with CMD, TGSPDCL helped Federation in

bringing them to his notice and we are thankful to him for agreeing to form a Co-Ordination Committee and monthly meetings to resolve the issues.

I am happy to inform that number of long pending issues were started attended to by the DISCOM after the meeting, and more importantly, TGERC has agreed to extend the time for implementation of KVARh billing to June 30 due to consistent follow up and number of representations submitted by Federation.

The present economic environment is facing headwinds from growing tensions in the Middle East and trade policy uncertainty. Despite the adverse global conditions, India remained the fastest growing economy with estimated GDP growth rate at 7.6 per cent for 2025-26, and an estimated 6.6 per cent for 2026-27. Though the growth rate is not sufficient to achieve the target of Viksit Bharat by 2047, considering the global economic and geo-political conditions, the performance of Indian economy is consistent.

The conflict in the Middle East is testing the resilience of economies of all the countries. The halt in shipments through the Strait of Hormuz and the closure and damage of some energy infrastructure have generated a surge in energy prices and disrupted the global supply of energy and other important commodities. The economy is bracing for fuel shocks and the growth rate can be lower than the estimated one.

The steep fall in rupee value and fall in foreign exchange reserves, continued supply disruptions made Prime Minister to call for austerity measures. This has led to a wide spread speculation about the supply conditions and the status of foreign exchange reserves with India and the future growth rate.

The statement can be looked at as restraining measure to reduce the supply constraints and improve the foreign exchange reserves by saving on dollar payments. As Kotak Mahindra advised - India should manage its economy like a “corporate balance sheet” by cutting down unnecessary consumption and reducing its reliance on foreign capital to become truly self-reliant, people and industry should be prepared for the worse case scenarios, unless the West Asia crisis gets over.

But, I am hopeful that the measures do not lead to loss of employment and reverse migrations as we witnessed during the Covid-19 period, that further deepens the employment crisis and economic growth.

The activities of Federation during the presidential year 2025-26 focussed on three important premises:

- ▶ Development and strengthening infrastructure (physical and digital)
- ▶ Improving the quality of human capital (skilled labour), and
- ▶ Enabling business environment (supportive policies, finance, and Compliances).

Together, this year’s activities have definitely made an impact on the Telangana’s economy and Federation is recognized as a reliable Association for any kind of support to further the MSME and industrial growth in the State.

I am happy to inform that the visit of Business Delegation to Japan from November 29 to December 6, was very fruitful and the Federation developed contact with key organizations working for promotion of international business and MSMEs in Japan, like JETRO offices at different cities viz, Tokyo, Hiroshima, Osaka; Embassy of India at Tokyo, Yokohama India Centre, Hiroshima Chamber of Commerce and Industry, Osaka Chamber of Commerce and Industry, Organization for Small & Medium Enterprises and Regional Innovation, Japan (SMRJ), Osaka, Office of Consul General, Osaka-Kobe etc.

I am also happy to inform that FTCCI is promoting collaboration between Japanese companies and companies in Telangana by supporting CEO Business Meeting Events of SMRJ.

I like to place on record my appreciation and recognition of efforts made by Vinod Agarwal, Chair, Energy Committee in convincing the CMD of TGSPDCL to have a monthly interaction with industry members to understand the challenges / issues faced by industrial consumers and resolve / mitigate them. Till now, three monthly meetings are held and we are proud to announce that number of issues brought to the notice of CMD are addressed. We also thank Mr. Jitesh V. Patil, IAS, CMD, TGSPDCL for his proactive approach.

FTCCI-Pokarna Skill Centre:

In the last one year, the FTCCI Pokarna Skill Centre has conducted a total of 23 structured training programs, workshops, and awareness sessions, reinforcing its

commitment to industry-relevant skill development and professional capacity building. These initiatives collectively engaged 812 participants, including working professionals, entrepreneurs, MSMEs, students, and institutional representatives.

The programs covered a wide range of domains such as Leadership Development, Export-Import (EXIM) Management, Financial Planning, HR Analytics, Entrepreneurship Development, workplace skills, and emerging business practices. Flagship programs including the Leadership Development Program, EXIM Certification Sessions, HR Analytics Workshop, and Financial Literacy initiatives received strong participation and positive feedback for their practical, application-oriented approach.

A significant impact of these initiatives has been the Centre’s ability to bridge the gap between theoretical knowledge and real-world application. Participants benefited from expert-led sessions, interactive methodologies, and industry case discussions, enabling them to enhance their managerial effectiveness, entrepreneurial capabilities, and financial decision-making skills. Additionally, collaborative programs with institutions and industry bodies expanded outreach and strengthened ecosystem linkages.

Overall, the FTCCI Pokarna Skill Centre has played a vital role in building a skilled, informed, and future-ready workforce, while fostering a culture of continuous learning and professional excellence in the region.

MSME Advisory Services:

The FTCCI MSME Advisory Services, under the leadership of Mr. B. P. Acharya (IAS Retd.), continues to serve as a vital platform for addressing the challenges faced by MSMEs and member companies of FTCCI.

The advisory meets periodically, typically on Thursdays, providing a structured forum for industry stakeholders to present and resolve key operational and policy-related issues.

The committee comprises distinguished members including Dr. Yerram Raju, Mr. Naveen Reddy (OSD to Secretary, Industries, Government of Telangana), Mr. Harsha (Ex-Banker), Mr. Vittal (TGIIC), and Dr. Ankit Bhatnagar (Convener).

Their collective expertise across finance, governance, and industry enables a comprehensive approach to problem-solving. During the last year, the committee took up 17 cases, providing focused guidance and facilitating resolution through expert consultation.

Based on specific requirements, the Advisory Services actively engage domain experts to offer insights and solutions on critical issues such as delayed payments, industrial land matters, subsidies, industrial financing, and MSME schemes.

Efforts of FTCCI: Representations to Government

Being the ‘Voice of Industry’, FTCCI made efforts to bring the challenges faced by industry to the notice of the

government and concerned officials from time to time

The major issues put forth before the state and central governments are given:

TO STATE GOVERNMENT:

To: Duddilla Sridhar Babu, Hon'ble Minister for Industries & Commerce, IT, E & C and Legislative Affairs, Govt. of Telangana

Subject: Highlighted the need for supporting and protecting the exporters from Telangana to mitigate the difficulties faced by exporters due to increased Tariffs by USA.

FTCCI recommended to government to Exempt Trade License Fee to manufacturing industries; Reduction of Trade License Fee for commercial establishments; Release of pending incentives to MSMEs and large industries; and offer Subsidy on logistics cost to exporters and importers

To: Sri Navin Mittal, IAS, Spl Chief Secretary to Govt, Department of Energy and Sri Md. Musharraf Faruqui, IAS, CMD, TGSPDCL

Subject:The Tariff Order for 2025-26 directed the DISCOMs to unblock the leading KVARh for the purpose of KVah billing by serving three months' notice to the industrial and commercial consumers. FTCCI submitted that, though the regulatory shift is welcome, the time limit provided is insufficient as majority of consumers were not aware of the details and how to maintain power factor at unity.

Requested to extend the time till the end of the FY 2025-26.

To: Dr. G. Malsur, Director of Industries, Govt. of Telangana

Subject: requested to exempt micro and small industries from levying Ground Water Extraction charges as per the central guidelines, to reduce the trade license fee that was hiked exorbitantly with change in calculation of fee on the basis of per square feet and road width; to introduce One Time Settlement Scheme for power dues to revive the closed units due to non-payment of power bills. Requested Dr. Malsur to take up the issues with CM office and resolve.

To: Sri D. Sridhar Babu, Hon'ble Minister for Industries and Commerce, IT E&C, Govt. of Telangana

Subject: Govt. issued orders in respect of "Hyderabad Industrial Lands Transformation Policy (HILTP)" for the strategic conversion of industrial lands within and near the ORR for multi-use zones. FTCCI requested for extension of timelines and rationalisation of conditions under HILTP such as: extension / removal of sunset clause, rationalization of development impact fee and removal of forfeiture clause.

Submitted one more representation to extend the time and to remove the ambiguities by releasing the guidelines.

Outcome: Guidelines on HILTP were released on 22nd May 2026

To: Hon'ble Chairman, TGERC

Subject: the DISCOMs have implemented the RST Order for 2024-25 unblocking leading KVARh for the purpose of KVah billing for LT and HT Metered Services. FTCCI appealed to the Hon'ble Commission to defer the implementation of Retail Supply Tariff Order dated 29.04.2025 and extend the time for KVah Billing by six months, i.e. from March 31st to September 30, 2026.

Outcome: The Hon'ble Commission has deferred the implementation of KVah billing by 3 months. i.e. till June 30, 2026

To: Mallu Bhatti Vikramarka, Hon'ble Deputy Chief Minister and Minister for Finance, Energy and Planning, Duddilla Sridhar Babu, Hon'ble Minister for IT E&C, Industries and Commerce; Special Chief Secretary, Finance Department and Special Chief Secretary, Energy; Commissioner of Industries

Subject: FTCCI, concerned by the large amounts of pending incentives, submitted representation to the Government recommending an allocation of Rs 3500 crore towards Industrial Promotion in Budget for FY 2026-27. Also requested to release the sanctioned budget for FY 2025-26 before March 31.

It was also recommended to create a separate head for Mega / Large Projects

Outcome: more than Rs 2500 crores was allocated towards IP and about 450 crores were released

To: Sri Duddilla Sridhar Babu, Hon'ble Minister for Industries and Commerce, IT C & E, Govt. of Telangana

Subject: requested the Minister to support industry, more particularly MSMEs, by recommending to extend the time to maintain Power Factor Near Unity, as it requires installation of equipment and cost involved.

Outcome: TGERC extended time till June 30, 2026

To: Sri Duddilla Sridhar Babu, Hon'ble Minister for IT E&C, Industries and Commerce; Chairman, TGERC

Subject: TGERC has Amended Retail Supply Tariff Order for FY 2025-26, withdrawing TOD Tariff for night time of Rs 1.50 less. This was contested by FTCCI and requested Government not to bring changes in the tariffs as it affects the cost of production for industries.

Outcome: The DISCOMs assured that rebate in tariff will be considered during solar hours in the day time in the RST for FY 2026-27

To: A. Revanth Reddy, Hon'ble Chief Minister of Telangana

Subject: the Telangana Clean and Green Energy Policy, though announced with an aim to promote green energy generation and consumption, is not getting implemented. It was requested to Fast track the implementation, expedite approval of pending Open Access applications and issue

NOCs for project developers.

To: Hon'ble Chairman, TGERC

Subject: it was requested to extend the time for implementation of kVArh Billing for HT Consumers for one year, instead of from April 1, as the equipment required to maintain PF at unity is expensive and not readily available in the market.

Outcome: Extended the time for implementation of KVARh billing by 2 months for HT consumers.

To: Sri Tummala Nageswara Rao, Hon'ble Minister for Handlooms & Textiles, Govt. of Telangana

Subject: it was brought to his notice that, local textiles processors have not been given orders for Indira Mahila Shakti Sarees and out sourced to units in Surat and other states. Federation requested to prioritise local textiles processing industry by providing them orders, and also suggested that supporting the local MSMEs creates employment and revenue to the govt.

Outcome: Hon'ble Minister assured that local industry will be given priority.

To: Hon'ble Chairman, TGERC; CMD, TGSPDCL

Subject: LT III Industrial Consumers are facing multiple challenges in the billing and categorization of consumers. Requested to consider increasing the Connected Load up to 125 HP for LT III Industry category and billing them on LT side in the forthcoming Order for FY 2026-27. This will provide them a leeway to upgrade without any financial burden. Also, not to burden the small consumers with HT metering for those whose connected load is above 50 HP.

Outcome: The DISCOM officials assured that the HT metering of those whose connected load is 50 HP and above is considered in three categories and will not burden the consumers.

To: Director General, Telangana Fire Disaster Response Emergency and Civil Defence Department

Subject: The department has The Telangana Fire Department has initiated the process of amending the Telangana Fire Services Act, 1999, with a focus on strengthening fire safety regulations, improving compliance mechanisms and streamlining the issuance of No Objection Certificates. FTCCI submitted its comments mainly on proposed changes in – risk-based compliance framework, safety manager requirement, multi-layered compliance and approval process etc.

Filings of Comments / Objections before the TGERC on various Petitions of TG DISCOMs, TG Transco and TG Genco

TO CENTRAL GOVERNMENT:

To: Shri Piyush Goyal, Hon'ble Minister of Commerce and Industry, Government of India

Subject: FTCCI has submitted its recommendations on how to mitigate the adverse impact of increased Tariffs

on exports from India by USA. The suggestions include: Trade-oriented reforms; Promote Brand India in alternate markets; Export credit support and logistics improvements; Release pending exporter incentives; Support exporters in exploring new markets

Outcome: The government of India has taken number of measures to support exporters considering the suggestions made by the industry associations across country, including developing Trade Connect Portal to develop trade relations with unconventional / unexplored markets.

To: Dr. Rajneesh, IAS, Addl. Secretary and Development Commissioner, Ministry of MSME

Subject: Ministry of MSME has conducted a cluster level workshop to get the feedback on observations survey on current status, challenges and key issues faced by MSMEs in Telangana. FTCCI submitted detailed feedback on on MSME Issues.

To: Sri Manish Mishra, Director, (R&R-I), Ministry of Power, Govt. of India

Subject: submitted the suggestions on Draft Electricity (Amendment) Bill 2025

To: Nitesh Bhasin, Under Secretary, Ministry of Labour & Employment, Govt. of India

Subject: The Ministry of Labour and Employment has released the Draft Rules (Notification No G.S.R 936 (E)) of Code on Wages, 2020; Occupational Safety, Health and Working Conditions, 2020; Code on Social Security, 2020 and Industrial Relations Code, 2020. FTCCI submitted its comments and suggestions on Draft Rules of all 4 Codes.

To: Dr. Mansukh Mandaviya, Hon'ble Minister of Labour and Employment, Government of India, Ms. Vandana Gurnani, IAS, Secretary (Labour & Employment), Govt. of India

Subject: The Ministry of Labour and Employment has announced the central rules for implementation of Labour Codes on May 8th, 2026 and FTCCI submitted that there are certain challenges faced by the employers in implementing the Social Security (Central) Rules 2026 pertaining to "ESIC".

that we are for revision of minimum wages, as they are long overdue, but the revision should be rationale, practical and justifiable. I thank all the industry associations- CII, Plastics Manufacturing Association, Jeedimetla, Cherlapally, Nacharam, Balanagar Industries’ Associations, etc. who collectively supported the cause.

It is always collective voice that is louder and heard. The recent issue of KVARh electricity billing and collective effort by the industry associations that brought temporary relief to the industrial consumers is another example. In future too, I sincerely hope that this togetherness will continue and we protect the interests of the industry and trade in our state.

I would like to place on record my sincere appreciation and thank our esteemed Past-Presidents, Managing Committee Members, Chairs and Co-Chairs and members of various Expert Committees for their support and guidance in carrying out my responsibilities.

I would like to thank all the patrons of FTCCI who made Federation stronger and self-sufficient to carryout and implement the activities successfully.

My special thanks to every member of Secretariat staff for their commitment, who worked relentlessly for making each and every program relevant, beneficial and successful. I am proud that Federation has shown its mettle and determination in taking our activities to the next step with the support of its secretariat under the guidance of expert committees.

Around 57 members attended the meeting. After confirming the presence of the requisite quorum, the meeting was called to order.

President Dr. Suresh Kumar Singhal welcomed all the members to the AGM. He stated that it was a privilege to present the 108th Annual Report of the Federation, along with the Annual Accounts and the Auditors' Report for the financial year 2024–25.

He extended his heartfelt thanks to all the members who actively contributed to the Federation's activities and supported its initiatives. He mentioned that serving as an Office Bearer of this esteemed institution had given him a valuable opportunity to learn and contribute meaningfully toward creating a business-friendly ecosystem in the State. He highlighted the Federation's active engagement in shaping key policies such as the Telangana MSME Policy and the Clean and Green Energy Policy, which stand as testimony to FTCCI's commitment to industry.

Addressing global market uncertainties, Dr. Singhal noted that natural disruptions, such as heavy rainfall during the third quarter, along with volatile international tariff announcements and retaliatory measures, contributed to the economic slowdown during FY 2024–25. He stated that India's strategy to counter these challenges includes signing multiple Free Trade Agreements (FTAs), diversifying export markets, and strengthening the domestic manufacturing sector. These initiatives have had a positive impact, with the manufacturing sector's share of GDP rising to 17%.

Dr. Singhal emphasized the Federation's three core objectives:

1) Advocacy and Support:

The Federation actively collaborates with both the Union and State Governments to advocate business-friendly policies. FTCCI also regularly hosts Ambassadors and Trade Counsellors from various countries to foster industrial growth and build global partnerships.

2) Networking and Collaboration:

He highlighted the importance of meaningful networking in expanding professional connections and exploring synergies. FTCCI is committed to cultivating a vibrant ecosystem that encourages collaboration and mutual growth.

3) Knowledge and Skills Enhancement:

He noted that the FTCCI–Pokarna Skill Centre offers a range of courses designed to equip individuals with relevant skills necessary for navigating the dynamic business landscape. He invited ideas and feedback from members to help shape the Federation's future journey.

He informed the members that 27 training programmes had been conducted covering skill development, capacity building, and domain-specific competencies. Additionally, the MSME Advisory Committee of FTCCI provided consultancy support to about 30 MSMEs.

Dr. Singhal shared concerns regarding key issues raised before the State and Central Governments, with detailed outcomes documented in the Annual Report for members' future reference.

He also provided an overview of a major achievement: the Federation had written to Sri Tummala Nageswara Rao, Hon'ble Minister for Agriculture, Handlooms & Textiles, Government of Telangana, requesting the expeditious release of outstanding dues payable to suppliers of Bathukamma sarees through TSCO (Telangana State Handloom Weavers' Co-operative Society). As a result, the Government promptly released 80% of the payments, followed by the balance amount, thereby providing much-needed financial relief to the suppliers.

Dr. Singhal also mentioned the Federation’s continued efforts toward:

- * Resolving issues related to Trade License Fees for manufacturing industries.
- * Seeking exemption for Micro and Small Enterprises from the requirement of obtaining NOCs for groundwater extraction.
- * Advocating revision of Minimum Wages.

He extended his gratitude to industry associations such as the Plastics Manufacturing Association, as well as the IALA Associations of Jeedimetla, Cherlapally, Nacharam, and Balanagar, for their collective support towards the wage revision efforts.

He expressed deep appreciation to the Secretariat staff for their dedication and contribution toward conceptualising and organising various initiatives of the Federation. He also acknowledged the Past Presidents, Managing Committee Members, Committee Chairs, Co-Chairs, Advisors, Members of various Expert Committees and member of FTCCI for their unwavering support and guidance.

He thanked the print and electronic media for their consistent coverage of the Federation’s activities, which enhanced its visibility and brand image.

Finally, he expressed his gratitude to the Hon’ble Chief Minister, Ministers, policymakers, and Government officials for considering and incorporating the Federation’s suggestions and recommendations into policymaking processes.

The Annual Report and Audited Accounts for the year 2024–25 had been circulated among the members. The floor was then opened for discussions and clarifications.

The President acknowledged the presence of the Statutory Auditor, Sri E. Ranganathan.

1) Adoption of the Annual Report and Audited Statement of Accounts:

The President stated that the Annual Report and the Audited Statement of Accounts of the Federation for 2024–25 had already been circulated to the members. He therefore proposed a motion to adopt the same.

After deliberations, the members unanimously passed the following resolution, duly proposed by Sri V V Sanyasi Rao and seconded by CA Hanmandloo K:

“RESOLVED THAT the Annual Report and Audited Accounts, together with the Auditors’ Report, for the year ended March 31, 2025, be and are hereby received and adopted by the Members of the Federation.”

2) Announcement of Appointment of the President and Senior Vice-President:

Dr. Suresh Kumar Singhal, President, declared Sri R. Ravi Kumar and Sri K.K. Maheshwari as President and Senior Vice-President, respectively, for the year 2025–26, in accordance with Articles 28(1)(b) and 15(5) of the Articles of Association of the Federation.

Dr Suresh Kumar Singhal formally handed over the charge of the Presidentship to Sri R. Ravi Kumar, who, in turn, handed over the charge of the Senior Vice-Presidentship to Sri K.K. Maheshwari.

Upon his election as President of FTCCI, Sri R. Ravi Kumar addressed the members of the Federation and expressed his gratitude to Dr. Suresh Kumar Singhal for proposing his name for the Presidentship. He also thanked the Managing Committee and all members for the faith and confidence reposed in him.

He conveyed his heartfelt appreciation to the outgoing President, Dr. Suresh Kumar Singhal, for his exemplary leadership, vision, commitment, and tireless efforts in strengthening the institution. He affirmed his intent to serve with utmost integrity, dedication, and inclusiveness.

Sri Ravi Kumar emphasized that his focus would be on enhancing member engagement, advocating industry-friendly policies, and fostering innovation and entrepreneurship. He committed to working collaboratively with the Government, industry bodies, and all stakeholders to ensure the continued relevance and impact of the Federation.

He further stated that he would work closely with the new team of Office Bearers, Committee Members, Past Presidents, and the Secretariat to steer the Federation toward a future of even greater service and significance.

Later, Senior Vice-President Sri K.K. Maheshwari addressed the members and expressed his deep sense of privilege in assuming the role of Senior Vice-President of this 108-year-old organisation. He thanked the Members of the Managing Committee, Past Presidents, and all members of the Federation for their confidence in him.

He affirmed his pride in the institution and his firm commitment to working diligently toward advancing the objectives of the Federation. He pledged his full support to the new President in all his endeavours and expressed his intent to contribute meaningfully to the initiatives and programmes that would propel the Federation forward.

Webinar on Tax Audit Compliances under the Income Tax Act : 11th October 2025 – Online

Sri R. Ravi Kumar, President, FTCCI, delivered the Welcome Address and highlighted the growing importance of tax audit compliance in the evolving regulatory environment. He emphasized the need for professionals to remain updated with ongoing amendments and interpretations.

Union Budget 2026–27: Analysis & Its Implications for Trade and Industry : 2nd February 2026 – FTCCI Surana Auditorium, Federation House

Sri R. Ravi Kumar, President, FTCCI, welcomed the gathering and referred to the Union Budget 2026–27 presented by the Hon'ble Finance Minister, Smt. Nirmala Sitharaman. Sri Giridhar Mamidi presented an overview of the Budget's macroeconomic framework, key highlights of the Economic Survey, growth outlook, and fiscal priorities.

CA P.V.S. Satyaprasad, Partner, M/s. Prasad & Prasad, Chartered Accountants, discussed direct tax proposals covering procedural amendments, decriminalization measures, policy changes, and rationalization of TDS/TCS provisions.

Sri Amit Kumar Fitkariwal, Partner, Deloitte India, Hyderabad, explained the GST and Customs proposals, including reforms in intermediary services, IDS refunds, AEO facilitation, duty rationalization, and sector-specific implications.

Seminar on TDS Provisions – Critical Issues : 16th March 2026 – FTCCI Surana Auditorium, Federation House

Sri Krishna Kumar Maheshwari, Senior Vice President, FTCCI, welcomed the guests and participants and emphasized the importance of TDS in ensuring timely tax collection, financial discipline, and compliance. He highlighted the need for stakeholders to stay updated with the provisions of the Income Tax Act, 2025, to avoid penalties and litigation.

CA Naresh Chandra Gelli V, Chair of the Committee, delivered the introductory remarks and emphasized the significance of TDS in the direct tax system. He highlighted key compliance challenges relating to deduction, documentation, reconciliation, and timely filing, and stated that the seminar aimed to provide clarity on the evolving TDS framework under the Income Tax Act, 2025.

The seminar was graced by Dr. P. V. Pradeep Kumar, IRS, Principal Commissioner of Income Tax, Hyderabad, as the Chief Guest. Senior officials of the Income Tax Department, including Sri Daram Venkateswara Rao, IRS, Joint Commissioner of Income Tax; Sri V.A.T.V. Kumar, IRS, Deputy Commissioner of Income Tax – TDS; Sri Mathivanan S.A., IRS, Additional Commissioner of Income Tax; and Sri Srinath Sadanala, IRS, Additional Commissioner of Income Tax, also attended the programme.

Dr. P. V. Pradeep Kumar, IRS, appreciated FTCCI for organizing the seminar at a crucial juncture ahead of the implementation of the TDS provisions under the Income Tax Act, 2025 from 1st April 2026. He highlighted simplification measures under the new Act, including consolidation of sections, rationalization of rates, and increased use of technology and data analytics for compliance monitoring. He also stressed the importance of accurate reporting and ethical compliance.

The technical session by CA Pankaj Kumar Trivedi, Partner, Trivedi and Bang Chartered Accountants, covered key

amendments and practical issues relating to TDS and TCS provisions. The session included discussions on the “Tax Year,” automation of lower/nil TDS certificates, revised correction timelines, Section 194T, TDS on property transactions, salary-related issues, TDS on rent, reporting timelines, threshold limits, PAN-Aadhaar linkage, Form 3CD disclosures, and common filing errors. He also highlighted the reduced two-year correction window and TCS reforms aimed at minimizing litigation and improving transparency.

The session concluded with an interactive discussion on practical issues relating to TDS compliance and filings.

Discussions focused on power generation, transmission and distribution systems, billing and regulatory matters, and policy and operational issues affecting industrial consumers. Members shared practical challenges, field-level experiences, and suggestions for systemic and regulatory improvements.

The meeting concluded with a constructive exchange of views, and the audit officials took note of the issues raised for consideration in sectoral audits and policy-level recommendations.

Meeting with TGERC Chairman on Energy-Related Issues : 18 March 2026 – Vidhyuth Nyantranalayam, Hyderabad

Sri Anil Agarwal, Past President, and Smt. T. Sujatha, Senior Director, FTCCI, met the Chairman and discussed key energy-related issues, including extension of the KVAh billing implementation and ToD Tariff, for the benefit of industrial consumers.

Stakeholders’ Meeting with Sri Jitesh V. Patil, IAS, Chairman and Managing Director, TGSPDCL : 17th April, 2026 – J S Krishnamurthy Hall

The meeting provided a platform for industry representatives and power sector stakeholders to discuss key issues affecting industries and power consumers in Telangana.

Sri R. Ravi Kumar, President, FTCCI, welcomed the gathering and underscored the importance of continuous industry–utility engagement for enhancing ease of doing business and strengthening Telangana’s industrial competitiveness. Sri Vinod Kumar Agarwal, Chairman, Energy Committee, FTCCI, highlighted concerns relating to Open Access, KVAh billing, rooftop solar policies, power quality, tariff issues, and regulatory procedures.

Addressing the participants, Sri Jitesh V. Patil, IAS, stated that industries are among TGSPDCL’s most valued consumers and assured that their concerns would receive due attention. He encouraged stakeholders to submit issues with supporting documents and informed that TGSPDCL is developing a time-bound grievance redressal mechanism for transparent handling of industry representations. He also emphasised the need for collaborative efforts between industry and TGSPDCL to improve policy implementation and regulatory effectiveness.

A key outcome of the meeting was the decision to constitute a Joint Industry–TGSPDCL Coordination Committee for regular engagement with industry stakeholders. It was also agreed to hold monthly stakeholder meetings at FTCCI on the 15th or 16th of every month to review and resolve industry-related power issues.

The discussions covered delays in Open Access approvals, restrictions on Open Access for new industries, KVAh billing refunds, rationalisation of Cross Subsidy Surcharge (CSS), rooftop solar and net metering regulations, implementation of PM-KUSUM projects, policy consultation mechanisms, industrial tariff categorisation, One Time Settlement (OTS) schemes for stressed industrial units, and delays in implementation of CGRF and court orders.

Responding positively, the CMD assured that several issues would be reviewed at the policy level in consultation with TGREDCO, TGERC, and other power sector stakeholders. He reiterated TGSPDCL’s commitment to a transparent, rules-based system and strengthening industry confidence in Telangana’s power sector.

Webinar on the Role of Industry in Net Zero 2070 : 11th October 2025 | Online

FTCCI organized a webinar on the role of industry in achieving India’s Net Zero 2070 target.

Sri R. Ravi Kumar, President, FTCCI, in his welcome address, emphasized the importance of integrating sustainability into business strategies and adopting green technologies to support India’s commitment under the Paris Agreement.

Delivering the keynote address, Sri Sharath Kumar Pallerla, Scientist ‘G’, Ministry of Environment, Forest and Climate Change (MoEFCC), Government of India, highlighted the impact of climate change and outlined India’s Panchamrit commitments, including 500 GW non-fossil fuel energy capacity, 50% renewable energy usage by 2030, reduction in carbon emissions and carbon intensity, and achieving Net Zero emissions by 2070.

Sri G. Bala Subramanyam, Chair of the Committee, FTCCI, stressed the need for collective action involving government, industry, academia, and citizens to address climate change and highlighted the achievements of India’s National Mission for Enhanced Energy Efficiency.

Programme on GHG Inventory Management for Managers: Building Reliable Data for Corporate Climate Action : 27th November 2025 - FTCCI Surana Auditorium, Federation House

Sri R. Ravi Kumar, President, FTCCI, highlighted the importance of accurate and transparent GHG reporting.

Sri G. Bala Subramanyam, Chair, ESG Committee, FTCCI, emphasized the need for organizations to build internal capabilities for generating audit-ready GHG data amid increasing climate disclosure requirements.

The technical sessions were conducted by Sri Bhavin Mudiya, Founder, EHS Solutions, and Ms. Nivedita Pradhan, Deputy Manager – ESG, NEPRA. The sessions covered: Climate policy and emission factor databases; ISO standards and scope-wise emission calculations; and Verification of GHG statements’ Demonstration of the ESG Konnect Tool;

Seminar on “Decoding the Landmark GST Reforms” : 20 September 2025 - FTCCI Surana Auditorium, Federation House

FTCCI organized a seminar on the recommendations of the 56th GST Council relating to rate rationalization and the new “Simple Tax” structure effective from 22 September 2025.

Sri R. Ravi Kumar, President, FTCCI, in his welcome address, highlighted the implications of the revised GST slabs of 5%, 18%, and 40% on pricing, compliance, refunds, MSMEs, and sectors such as Pharma, Real Estate, and Hospitality.

CA Mohd. Irshad Ahmed, Chair of the Committee, briefed participants on significant GST developments impacting costs, pricing, and annual returns. Sri Mallikarjuna Gupta B., Co-Chair, introduced the speakers, Sri Amit Kumar Fitkariwal, Partner, Deloitte Touche Tohmatsu, and Sri S. Srujan Kumar, Director, Deloitte Touche Tohmatsu.

Sri Amit Kumar Fitkariwal spoke on the evolving GST landscape, key announcements of the 56th GST Council Meeting, trade facilitation measures, export liberalization, post-supply discounts, and operationalization of the GST Appellate Tribunal (GSTAT). Sri S. Srujan Kumar elaborated on rate rationalization measures, transition challenges, and the future outlook.

Panel Discussion - Moderated by Sri Srinivas Garimella, Vice President, FTCCI, with panelists Sri K. Ravi, Joint Commissioner (Policy), Telangana State GST; Sri Simhachalan Mohanty, Head of Global Taxation, Dr. Reddy’s Laboratories; Sri P. The discussion focused on GST policy framework, compliance, revenue protection, stakeholder engagement, and ongoing GST reforms.

Sri Mujeebur briefed the FTCCI team on Afghanistan’s recent economic developments, highlighting new policies, special economic zones, tax incentives, and simplified licensing procedures aimed at attracting investment. He shared that Afghanistan’s imports significantly outweigh its exports and invited Indian industries to explore opportunities in sectors such as mining and manufacturing. He also sought FTCCI’s support in addressing issues related to visas and border logistics, which have impacted Afghan trade with India. In response, the FTCCI President advised the Consulate to submit a detailed representation of these challenges so that FTCCI could formally take up the matter with the relevant government authorities.

The meeting concluded with a mutual commitment to strengthen collaboration and promote trade and investment opportunities between India and Afghanistan.

Meeting with Senior Trade Commissioner, Canadian Consulate, South India Office : 2nd September 2025 - OPT Board Room, Federation House.

FTCCI met Sri Martin Barratt, Senior Trade Commissioner, Canadian Consulate, South India Office, to explore opportunities for strengthening India–Canada bilateral trade. Discussions focused on key trade sectors, mutual participation in trade initiatives, and enhancing business collaboration. The meeting was attended by FTCCI Office Bearers, Committee Chair Sri Chakravarthi AVPS, Sri Martin Barratt, and Sri Vikram Jain.

Meeting with H.E. Orhan Yalman Okan, Consul General of Türkiye : 8th September 2025 | President’s Cabin, Federation House.

FTCCI and the Turkish Consulate discussed promoting bilateral trade, participation in Turkish exhibitions, and sector-specific opportunities in textiles, chemicals, pharmaceuticals, and agriculture. FTCCI President Sri R. Ravi Kumar

proposed organizing a business delegation to Türkiye, subject to Managing Committee approval. Both sides agreed to strengthen commerce-driven cooperation for mutual economic growth.

Nirayat Bandhu Programme on “Export Opportunities to the UK and Benefits under India–UK CETA” : 11th September 2025 - FTCCI Surana Auditorium, Federation House.

Organized jointly with FIEO and DGFT, the programme highlighted opportunities arising from the India–UK Comprehensive Economic and Trade Agreement (CETA). Sri R. Ravi Kumar, President, FTCCI, emphasized market access and tariff benefits for Indian exporters. Dr. E. Vishnu Vardhan Reddy, IFS, Joint Secretary, Ministry of External Affairs, Govt. of India, encouraged the creation of an MSME Facilitation Desk. H.E. Sri Gareth Wynn Owen, British Deputy High Commissioner, Hyderabad, welcomed the agreement.

Sri AVPS Chakravarthi, Chair, International Trade Committee, FTCCI, highlighted CETA’s benefits for sectors such as pharmaceuticals, healthcare, digital technologies, textiles, gems & jewellery, engineering goods, and agri-products, besides opportunities in clean energy, EV components, and start-ups.

Sri K. Unnikrishnan, Joint Director General, FIEO, described CETA as a landmark agreement for Telangana exporters. Sri Sambhaji Chavan and Sri Akshay SC, Joint Directors, DGFT, explained the duty-free access available to 99% of Indian exports under the agreement.

Sri B. Ambedkar Raju, Department of Posts, presented the Dak Ghar Niryat Kendras initiative for MSME exporters, while Sri Amlendu Bipul Mishra, ECGC Ltd., outlined export credit insurance solutions to mitigate trade risks and improve access to finance.

Meeting with the Vice Consul of Iran, Sri. Mohsen Moghaddami : 16th October, 2025 - OPT Board Room, Federation House.

A meeting was held with Sri Mohsen Moghaddami, Vice Consulate of Iran, wherein he requested FTCCI to organize a webinar in collaboration with the Isfahan Chamber of Commerce to explore business and investment opportunities in Isfahan. Sri. Moghaddami further requested FTCCI to share its promotional film for wider dissemination and proposed signing a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) between the Isfahan Chamber of Commerce, Industries, Mines and Agriculture and FTCCI to establish strong business and industrial relations between the two regions. He also provided detailed information on various investment opportunities available in Isfahan, highlighting the city’s potential across multiple sectors.

In response to the proposal, FTCCI agreed to support the initiative by organizing a webinar as an initial step to facilitate dialogue and understanding between the business communities. FTCCI suggested that based on the outcomes and response from the webinar, the matter of signing an MOU would be taken up for further deliberation and approval by the Managing Committee of FTCCI in due course. This phased approach would enable both parties to assess the synergies and potential areas of collaboration.

Meeting with Canadian High Commission Delegation : 31st October 2025 - J.S. Krishnamurthy Hall, Federation House.

Sri R. Ravi Kumar, President, FTCCI, highlighted Telangana’s strengths in IT, pharmaceuticals, biotechnology, defence, and advanced manufacturing. Sri Chakravarthi AVPS, Chair of the Committee, emphasized easier visa access and the need for a Free Trade Agreement.

Sri Christopher Cooter, High Commissioner of Canada, highlighted opportunities for Canadian investments in India and stressed the importance of student exchanges, skill development initiatives, and sector-specific collaborations, particularly in Pharmaceuticals, Critical Minerals, Agro Products, Defence, and Renewable Energy. He also encouraged FTCCI to lead a business delegation to Canada.

Sri Martin and Sri Jager advocated enhanced trade and investment engagement. Concluding the meeting, Sri R. Ravi Kumar, President, FTCCI, proposed exploring synergies with Telangana’s Skill University and Future City, and suggested a Defence sector round table.

Conference on “Business Resilience & Global Trade Management” : 6th February 2026 | The Leela Hyderabad

The Committee, in collaboration with the Ministry of External Affairs and State Bank of India, organized a full-day conference attended by over 150 exporters, importers, and MSMEs.

Sri Srinivas Garimella, Vice President, FTCCI, highlighted Telangana's growing export potential. Sri Chakravarthi AVPS, Chair of the Committee, emphasized India's evolving role in global trade. Dr. Arvind Virmani, Member, NITI Aayog, delivered the keynote address on India's economic growth, employment, manufacturing, skilling, and trade reforms. Sri Sanjay Kumar, Special Chief Secretary, Government of Telangana, presented the State's export growth and investment initiatives. Sri P.S. Workshop on Trade Connect Portal – Sequel Workshop : 16th February 2026 - FTCCI Surana Auditorium, Federation House.

As a follow-up to the conference, FTCCI organized a hands-on workshop on the Trade Connect Portal under the Foreign Trade Policy 2023.

Sri R. Ravi Kumar, President, FTCCI, stressed the importance of digital trade facilitation, while Sri Chakravarthi AVPS, Chair of the Committee, highlighted the portal's role in providing market intelligence.

Special addresses were delivered by Sri Sambhaji Appasaheb Chavan and Sri Akshay S.C., Joint Directors General of Foreign Trade (DGFT), delivered special addresses on the Government of India's vision for the Trade Connect Portal. Ms. Dhiya R., Deputy Director General of Foreign Trade (DGFT), conducted a live demonstration covering Harmonized System (HS) Code-based insights, Free Trade Agreement (FTA) benefits, trade opportunities, and portal registration. FTCCI, with the support of the Ministry of External Affairs (MEA) and the Directorate General of Foreign Trade (DGFT), facilitated exporter registrations and onboarding assistance.

Round Table Meeting with H.E. Prof. Kwasi Obiri-Danso, High Commissioner of Ghana to India : 8th April 2026 - J.S. Krishnamurthy Hall, Federation House.

Sri R. Ravi Kumar, President, FTCCI, highlighted opportunities for collaboration between Telangana and Ghana in healthcare, fintech, agri-tech, and education. Sri Chakravarthi AVPS, Chair of the Committee, proposed establishing an India-Ghana Business Council under FTCCI to promote trade and investment.

H.E. Prof. Kwasi Obiri-Danso outlined investment opportunities in pharmaceuticals, mining, agriculture, special economic zones, and the African Continental Free Trade Area (AfCFTA). He emphasized Ghana's stable governance, investor-friendly policies, and strategic position as a gateway to West Africa.

Programme on “Guarding Lives, Protecting Property: Fire Safety Starts with Us” : 4th June 2025 - FTCCI Surana Auditorium, Federation House.

FTCCI organized a programme on “Guarding Lives, Protecting Property: Fire Safety Starts with Us” to promote awareness and strengthen fire safety practices across industries, commercial establishments, and public spaces. The programme brought together government officials, industry experts, and stakeholders to discuss fire prevention, preparedness, and safety compliance.

Dr. Suresh Kumar Singhal, President, FTCCI, welcomed the gathering and emphasized that fire safety is a shared responsibility of regulators, businesses, professionals, and citizens.

Delivering the theme address, Sri Ravi Kumar, Senior Vice President, FTCCI, highlighted the rising incidence of fire accidents in Telangana and Hyderabad. Referring to a recent tragic fire accident that claimed 17 lives, he stressed the need for collaborative efforts and practical solutions to create a safer environment.

Sri Bendi Raja Gopala Rao, Director of Factories, Government of Telangana, emphasized compliance with the Factories Act, 1948 and its amendments, particularly provisions relating to ventilation, fire protection, and safe storage of materials. The sessions covered topics such as Industrial Innovation, Digital Transformation, Artificial Intelligence, Smart Manufacturing, Renewable Energy, Cybersecurity, Startup Ecosystems, MSME Growth Opportunities, Sustainability, and Emerging Technologies. The Panel Discussion focused on the theme of “Accelerating Industrial Growth through Innovation, Technology Adoption and MSME Empowerment.”

The success of IITEX 2025 was further strengthened by the support of key partners including Union Bank of India, LIC, Neovatic Technologies, Kotak Mahindra Bank, SIDBI, IPOG Technologies Pvt. Ltd., Bondada Group, Truzon Solar, Margadarsi Chit Fund, Ampleton Solar, and Asset Integrated Solutions by Tally. Encouraged by the overwhelming response, FTCCI has resolved to transform IITEX into an annual flagship industrial expo, positioning it as a catalyst for MSME growth, industrial innovation, and the vision of Atmanirbhar Bharat. The exceptional participation, strong government support, and measurable business outcomes reaffirm FTCCI’s leadership in creating impactful platforms that translate policy objectives into tangible economic opportunities.

FTCCI POKARNA SKILL CENTRE

Financial Literacy & Empowerment Drive for Rural Women : 6–7 May 2025 - Singareni Collieries, Kothagudem

FTCCI Pokarna Skill Centre conducted a Financial Literacy and Empowerment Drive for rural women and employees of Singareni Collieries Company Limited (SCCL). The programme focused on savings, budgeting, digital banking, government financial schemes, Mudra loans, and women-centric credit facilities. Mining Officers and senior SCCL officials actively supported the initiative and committed to facilitating future training programmes.

Financial Literacy Programme for Rural Women : 17th & 26th May 2025 - Medchal

Sponsored by NewSpace India Limited (NSIL), this two-day programme trained 90 rural women in budgeting, savings, banking, digital transactions, government schemes, and entrepreneurship financing. A major outcome was the facilitation of 30 Mudra loan applications. Interactive sessions conducted in the local language enhanced financial awareness and encouraged women to pursue entrepreneurial opportunities.

Two-Day Training Programme on Data Science for Business Decision Making – Power BI : 28–29 May 2025 - Safran Electrical and Power India Pvt. Ltd.

A specialized training programme was conducted for 25 employees of Safran Electrical and Power India Private Limited on Microsoft Power BI. Participants gained practical skills in data analytics, dashboard creation, data visualization, and business intelligence through hands-on exercises, real-time projects, and group activities, strengthening data-driven decision-making capabilities.

Visit of Ms. Uma Shekhar : 7th June 2025 - FTCCI Pokarna Skill Centre

Ms. Uma Shekhar, Additional Secretary, Ministry of Foreign Affairs & Director, NewSpace India Limited (NSIL), visited the Skill Centre to review programmes undertaken under the NSIL framework. She interacted with FTCCI officers, staff, and interns, appreciated their efforts in skill development and financial literacy outreach, and shared insights on national security, recent developments relating to the Pahalgam incident, Operation Sindoor, and the Indus Waters Treaty.

Participants explored opportunities for knowledge sharing, supervisor development, and strengthening industry-academia partnerships.

Certificate Course on Export Import Management : 22–25 September 2025 - FTCCI Pokarna Skill Centre

The four-day programme attracted entrepreneurs, manufacturers, academicians, and industry professionals. Key topics included Foreign Trade Policy, International Trade, Export-Import Finance & Exchange Regulations, Customs Procedures, Transforming Global Trade with Data-Driven Intelligence, International Contract Management, and International Logistics, Packaging & Labelling. The programme focused on capacity building and supporting emerging exporters and startups.

Advanced Module on EXIM : 14–15 October 2025 - FTCCI Pokarna Skill Centre

Participants learned about identifying high-potential export markets, discovering verified buyers, leveraging AI platforms, Building Market Entry Reports, Cost-Effective Research, Export Scaling Strategies, and Trend Forecasting. The programme concluded with an industrial visit to GMR Air Cargo on 16 October 2025, providing practical exposure to EXIM logistics and operations.

Conference on Leadership in a Changing World: Driving Strategy, Digital Transformation, and GCC Growth : 20th November 2025 - The Leela Palace, Hyderabad

Jointly organized by FTCCI and IMA, the conference brought together senior leaders from EY, Deloitte, MassMutual, TCS, Tesco, Reckitt, and leading Global Capability Centres (GCCs). Discussions focused on strategy, finance transformation, AI-driven enterprise models, digital innovation, analytics, automation, and the evolving role of GCCs as strategic value creators. FTCCI and IMA exchanged an MoU to facilitate the offering of IMA US Programmes through FTCCI.

Certificate Course in Export Import Management : 19–23 January 2026 - FTCCI Pokarna Skill Centre

The programme aimed at capacity building, employability enhancement, and economic growth. Twenty participants, including startup founders, entrepreneurs, academicians, and women entrepreneurs, attended the course. An industrial visit to GMR Air Cargo provided practical exposure to export-import processes and logistics operations.

Workshop on Leading Productivity – A Toolkit to Managers : 11th February 2026 - FTCCI Pokarna Skill Centre

This one-day workshop equipped managers, leaders, and business owners with practical tools to improve productivity, identify high-value work, eliminate productivity bottlenecks, and achieve disciplined execution for measurable outcomes.

Financial Literacy Session at ISRO : 13 March 2026 - Bengaluru

FTCCI conducted a Financial Literacy Session at the headquarters of the Indian Space Research Organisation (ISRO). The session was delivered by Dr. V. V. S. Sarma and Dr. Ankit Bhatnagar, covering investment planning, risk management, retirement planning, wealth creation, diversification, and informed financial decision-making. The initiative reflected NSIL's commitment to promoting financial literacy and informed financial planning across sectors.

Food Safety Training and Certification (FoSTaC) Programme : 17th March 2026 - KLN Auditorium

FTCCI, in collaboration with FSSAI under the KFC India Sahyog Initiative, conducted a Food Safety Training and Certification (FoSTaC) Programme for food vendors.

Smt. Harichandana Dasari, IAS, District Collector, Hyderabad, emphasized the importance of providing safe, hygienic, and quality food. **REPORT OF ADVISORY/CONSULTATIVE COMMITTEES
(REPRESENTED BY FTCCI)**

State Level Committee (SLC) / Scrutiny-cum-Verification Committee (SVC) Meetings held during FY 2025-26 (April 2025 to March 2026):

During the financial year 2025–26 (April 2025 to March 2026), the Commissionerate of Industries, Government of Telangana, conducted a **total of seven** SVC meetings, followed by corresponding SLC meetings, for the sanction of industrial incentives under the T-IDEA and T-PRIDE schemes for entrepreneurs belonging to the General, PwD, SC, and ST categories. The meetings were held on 9 May 2025 (98th SVC), 26 May 2025 (99th SVC), 1 July 2025 (100th SVC), 16 October 2025 (101st SVC), 20 November 2025 (102nd SVC), 30 December 2025 (103rd SVC), and 11 March 2026 (104th SVC).

During the year, the SVC approved and recommended to the SLC a total of 6,596 applications involving a cumulative **incentive amount of Rs. 1,529.39 crore**. All recommendations were subsequently approved and sanctioned by the State Level Committee.

The Government of Telangana allocated Rs. 2,397.07 crore during FY 2025–26 for industrial promotion. Subsequently, an additional allocation of Rs. 385.50 crore was provided, increasing the total budget provision for the year to Rs. 2,782.57 crore.

Against the total budget provision of Rs. 2,782.57 crore, LOCs amounting to Rs. 1,407.25 crore were issued up to the end of March 2026.

As of 10 March 2026, a total of 67,188 applications were pending for the release of incentives, involving an aggregate amount of Rs. 5,967.92 crore.

DIPC and TG-iPASS Meeting - 27 May 2025 – Hyderabad Collectorate Office

The meeting was held under the chairmanship of the General Manager, District Industries Centre (DIC), Hyderabad. The meeting reviewed approvals and clearances under TG-iPASS, sanction of industrial incentives under the General Category, incentives for Persons with Disabilities (PwD), SCP Enterprises incentives, TSP Enterprises incentives, and allotment of scarce raw materials.

During the meeting, it was informed that two applications were pending for approval. The Committee approved proposals for sanction of investment subsidy to:

- 9 units under the General Category
- 5 units under the Scheduled Caste (SC) category
- 2 units under the Scheduled Tribe (ST) category

The approvals under the SC and ST categories pertained to vehicle procurement-related applications.

DIPC and TG-iPASS Meeting : 30th December 2025 – Ranga Reddy Collectorate Office, Kongara Kalan, Ibrahimpatnam

The meeting was held under the chairmanship of the District Collector, Ranga Reddy District.

The meeting reviewed approvals and clearances under TG-iPASS, sanction of industrial incentives under the General Category, incentives for Persons with Disabilities (PwD), SCP Enterprises incentives, TSP Enterprises incentives, and allotment of scarce raw materials.

It was informed that 5 applications were pending at the pre-scrutiny stage and 6 applications were pending at the approval stage.

The Committee approved claim proposals for sanction of investment subsidy for:

- 3 units under the Scheduled Caste (SC) category, amounting to Rs. 8,16,847
- 2 units under the Scheduled Tribe (ST) category, amounting to Rs. 6,64,755

Meeting with the Special Chief Secretary to Government, Industries & Commerce Department : 23rd July 2025 – Telangana Secretariat

A meeting was held with representatives of major industry associations to discuss the proposed minimum wages recommended by the Minimum Wages Advisory Board.

It was proposed to revise the minimum wages to Rs. 20,257 per month for the unskilled category. The proposed revision was uniform across all scheduled employments. Officials from the Labour Department informed the participants that the proposed figure was arrived at using the 'Aykroyd Formula.' The Government proposed revising the wages to Rs. 17,500 instead of Rs. 20,257 recommended by the Board.

Industry representatives opposed the Government's proposal, citing the difficulties faced by industries and the cost escalation that could erode the competitiveness of Telangana industries.

The meeting was chaired by Sri Duddilla Sridhar Babu, Hon'ble Minister for Industries and Commerce, along with Sri Sanjay Kumar, IAS, Special Chief Secretary to Government, Industries and Commerce; Sri Dana Kishore, Principal Secretary to Government, LET & F; Sri Nikhil Chakravarthi, Director of Industries; and other Labour Department officials.

Sri Sanjay Meela, Chair, HR & IR Committee, and Smt. Sujatha, Senior Director, participated in the meeting.

The petitions of DISCOMs for approval of revised ARR, FPT & CSS for FY 2026–27 in respect of Retail Supply Business. The public hearing was held on 7 March 2026 from 10:30 AM onwards. Sri Chanmeet Singh presented comments in person.

Webinar on Recovery of Delayed Payments to MSMEs : 8th August 2025 - Online

Sri Mahesh Siliveru, Assistant Manager, FTCCI, participated in the webinar. The session focused on the challenges faced by MSMEs due to delayed payments and provided insights into the legal provisions under the MSMED Act. Key discussions included reasons for delayed payments and their consequential effects on MSMEs, such as liquidity crunches, minimal profitability, and legal compliance issues.

Possible solutions highlighted included proper documentation, invoicing, professional consultations, and safeguarding business interests through statutory compliance. Advocate Kumar Prateek, Corporate and Commercial Lawyer & MSME Recovery Expert, led the session.

Public Hearing at TGERC, Vidyut Nyantran Bhavan : 23rd September 2025 – Sy. No.145-P, G.T.S. Colony, Kalyan Nagar

TGERC conducted a public hearing on ToD Tariff at Vidyut Nyantran Bhavan. On behalf of FTCCI and other associations, Sri Ramdeep Singh from Mercados presented objections, which were well received by the Hon'ble Commission.

From FTCCI, Sri Anil Agarwal, Past President; Sri Vinod Agarwal, Chair, Energy Committee; Sri Prakash Goenka, Member, Energy Committee; Sri Venkat N., Member, Energy Committee; and Sri Mahesh, Assistant Manager, participated.

Meeting with Officials of MSME-DFO : 10th October 2025 – MSME-DFO, Balanagar

MSME-DFO organized a preliminary meeting with industry associations to deliberate on recommendations relating to the cost and competitiveness of Indian MSMEs. Different industry associations in Telangana participated in the meeting and actively discussed the issues and challenges faced by the MSME sector, particularly in Telangana.

Sri Ravi Kumar, The President suggested that although the ease of doing business has improved considerably, a number of hurdles still exist. The infrastructure in existing industrial parks has not been adequately developed, and because of the underdevelopment of the industrial areas, the logistics cost for the MSMEs is very high. No common facilities are being developed, resulting in higher costs as individual units are required to create such facilities independently.

Sri P. Krishna, Chair, IDC pointed out that the land utilisation norms for industrial parks do not allow setting up of common facility centres and this is adding to the costs of MSMEs. The norms need to be changed, he suggested.

Sri Prem Kankaria, Chair, Banking and Insurance Committee said that the compliances are burdening the units, particularly the listed small companies. He said that a Rs. 500 crore company is treated on par with a Rs 5000 crore company which is not rational. The compliance burden needs to be reduced to make SMEs concentrate more on improving the competitiveness.

Smt. Sujatha, Sr. Director suggested that since most of the central government policies are only guidelines to State Governments, it should take measures that benefits MSMEs that are to be implemented by all the state governments mandatorily.

Zonal Level Conference on Cost & Competitiveness of MSMEs : 3rd December, 2025 - Tourism Plaza, Begumpet

MSME- Development and Facilitation Office organized this conference. Sri Prem Chand Kankaria, Chair of the Banking Committee and Member of IDC, highlighted the key challenges faced by MSMEs and offered several recommendations. He emphasized the need for the Central Government to issue clear guidelines on land costs, incentives, infrastructure, and the feasibility of bank loans, all of which are crucial for the survival and growth of MSMEs.

The meeting was attended by Sri Srinivas Battula and Sri Shaik Karimulla, Members of the IDC Committee, along with Sri F. Lokesh, Joint Director, and Sri S. Mahesh, Assistant Manager of FTCCI.

Meeting with the Commissioner of HYDRAA : 31st January, 2026 - Nampally

Sri Ranganath, Commissioner of HYDRAA convened a meeting of industry and trade associations and traders to brief participants on a fire accident that occurred in a furniture shop that claimed five lives, and cautioned the traders and industry people to follow preventive measures and guidelines provided by fire and HYDRAA departments. He also informed that from April, 2026, buildings may be sealed or appropriate legal action may be initiated.

The meeting was attended by Sri K. K. Maheshwari, Sr. Vice President, FTCCI, and Smt. T. Sujatha, Senior Director.

Buyer–Seller Meet : 15th March, 2026 - ICAR-NAARM, Rajendranagar, Hyderabad

Sri S. Chandra Mohan, Chair, Agro and Food Processing Committee of FTCCI, attended as a Guest of Honour for the inaugural session. He addressed the gathering along with the AGM, APEDA; DDG, NABARD; and CEO, a-IDEA, ICAR-NAARM. Sri S. Mahesh, Deputy Manager, FTCCI, attended the meeting.

Telangana Fire, Disaster Response, Emergency and Civil Defence Department – Stakeholders’ Meeting on Draft Amendments to the Fire Services Act : 27th April 2026 - FDRCD, Nanakramguda, Hyderabad.

A meeting of all the stakeholders, including builders, developers, industry representatives, etc. was convened by the department to discuss the proposed draft amendments to the Fire Services Act 1999 with the objective of strengthening fire safety regulations, improving compliance mechanisms, issuing No Objection Certificates (NOC) etc. on 27th April.

The officials of Fire Services presented the salient features of the draft amendment and sought constructive suggestions, feedback and objections.

From FTCCI, the following main concerns were raised:

1. The clause relating to “imprisonment for wilful negligence causing injuries/fatal accidents
2. appointment of Fire Safety Managers and
3. Third Party Audits by chartered engineers (from fire safety, civil or mechanical)
4. Mandatory NOC from Fire Dept by all the premises owners with 300 sq. metres or more of a floor

After hearing all the participants, the Director General requested industry associations to circulate the details of Amendments to the members and submit detailed objections / suggestions before May 15, 2026.

INDEPENDENT AUDITORS' REPORT

**To the Members of
The Federation of Telangana Chambers of Commerce and Industry**

Report on the Audit of the Standalone Financial Statements

Opinion

We have audited the standalone financial statements of The Federation of Telangana Chambers of Commerce and Industry (“the Federation”), which comprise the Balance Sheet as at 31st March 2026, and the statement of Income and Expenditure and cash flow statement for the year then ended, and notes to the financial statements, including a summary of significant accounting policies and other explanatory information.

In our opinion and to the best of our information and according to the explanations given to us, the aforesaid standalone financial statements give the information required by the Companies Act, 2013 in the manner so required and give a true and fair view in conformity with the accounting principles generally accepted in India, of the state of affairs of the Federation as at March 31, 2026, and its excess of Income over Expenditure, and its cash flows for the year ended on that date.

Basis for Opinion

We conducted our audit in accordance with the Standards on Auditing (SAs) specified under section 143(10) of the Companies Act, 2013. Our responsibilities under those Standards are further described in the Auditor’s Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section of our report. We are independent of the Federation in accordance with the Code of Ethics issued by the Institute of Chartered Accountants of India together with the ethical requirements that are relevant to our audit of the financial statements under the provisions of the Companies Act, 2013 and the Rules thereunder, and we have fulfilled our other ethical responsibilities in accordance with these requirements and the Code of Ethics. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our opinion.

Information Other than the Standalone Financial Statements and Auditor’s Report Thereon

The Federation’s Managing Committee is responsible for the preparation of the other information. The other information comprises the information included in the Managing Committee’s Report including Annexures to the Managing Committee’s Report, but does not include the standalone financial statements and our auditor’s report thereon. The annual report is expected to be made available to us after the date of our report.

Our opinion on the standalone financial statements does not cover the other information and we do not express any form of assurance conclusion thereon.

In connection with our audit of the standalone financial statements, our responsibility is to read the other information and, in doing so, consider whether the other information is materially inconsistent with the standalone financial statements or our knowledge obtained during the course of our audit or otherwise appears to be materially misstated.

If, based on the work we have performed, we conclude that there is a material misstatement of this other information, we are required to report that fact. We have nothing to report in this regard.

Responsibilities of Management and Those Charged with Governance for the Standalone Financial Statements

The Federation’s Managing Committee is responsible for the matters stated in section 134(5) of the Companies Act, 2013 (“the Act”) with respect to the preparation of these standalone financial statements that give a true and fair view of the financial position, financial performance, and cash flows of the Federation in accordance with the

accounting principles generally accepted in India, including the accounting Standards specified under section 133 of the Act. This responsibility also includes maintenance of adequate accounting records in accordance with the provisions of the Act for safeguarding of the assets of the Federation and for preventing and detecting frauds and other irregularities; selection and application of appropriate accounting policies; making judgments and estimates that are reasonable and prudent; and design, implementation and maintenance of adequate internal financial controls, that were operating effectively for ensuring the accuracy and completeness of the accounting records, relevant to the preparation and presentation of the financial statements that give a true and fair view and are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

In preparing the financial statements, the Managing Committee is responsible for assessing the Federation's ability to continue as a going concern, disclosing, as applicable, matters related to going concern and using the going concern basis of accounting unless the Managing Committee either intends to liquidate the Federation or to cease operations, or has no realistic alternative but to do so.

Those Managing Committee Members are also responsible for overseeing the Federation's financial reporting process.

Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements

Our objectives are to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements as a whole are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, and to issue an auditor's report that includes our opinion. Reasonable assurance is a high level of assurance, but is not a guarantee that an audit conducted in accordance with SAs will always detect a material misstatement when it exists. Misstatements can arise from fraud or error and are considered material if, individually or in the aggregate, they could reasonably be expected to influence the economic decisions of users taken on the basis of these financial statements.

Identify and assess the risks of material misstatement of the financial statements, whether due to fraud or error, design and perform audit procedures responsive to those risks, and obtain audit evidence that is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our opinion. The risk of not detecting a material misstatement resulting from fraud is higher than for one resulting from error, as fraud may involve collusion, forgery, intentional omissions, misrepresentations, or the override of internal control.

- * Obtain an understanding of internal control relevant to the audit in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances. Under section 143(3)(i) of the Companies Act, 2013, we are also responsible for expressing our opinion on whether the Federation has adequate internal financial controls system in place and the operating effectiveness of such controls.
- * Evaluate the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of accounting estimates and related disclosures made by management.
- * Conclude on the appropriateness of management's use of the going concern basis of accounting and, based on the audit evidence obtained, whether a material uncertainty exists related to events or conditions that may cast significant doubt on the Federation's ability to continue as a going concern. If we conclude that a material uncertainty exists, we are required to draw attention in our auditor's report to the related disclosures in the financial statements or, if such disclosures are inadequate, to modify our opinion. Our conclusions are based on the audit evidence obtained up to the date of our auditor's report. However, future events or conditions may cause the Federation to cease to continue as a going concern.
- * Evaluate the overall presentation, structure and content of the financial statements, including the disclosures, and whether the financial statements represent the underlying transactions and events in a manner that achieves fair presentation.

We communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit and significant audit findings, including any significant deficiencies in internal control that we identify during our audit.

We also provide those charged with governance with a statement that we have complied with relevant ethical requirements regarding independence, and to communicate with them all relationships and other matters that may reasonably be thought to bear on our independence, and where applicable, related safeguards.

Report on Other Legal and Regulatory Requirements

 - (c) The Balance Sheet, the Statement of Income and Expenditure, and the Cash Flow Statement dealt with by this Report are in agreement with the books of account.
 - (d) In our opinion, the aforesaid standalone financial statements comply with the Accounting Standards specified under Section 133 of the Act, read with Rule 7 of the Companies (Accounts) Rules, 2014 except for subscription from members in arrears which is accounted on cash basis.
 - (e) On the basis of the written representations received from the Directors (Managing Committee Members) as on 31st March, 2026 taken on record by the Board of Directors (Managing Committee Members) none of the Directors (Managing Committee Members) is disqualified as on 31st March, 2026 from being appointed as a Director (Managing Committee Member) in terms of Section 164(2) of the Act.
 - (f) In our opinion considering nature of activity, size of operation and organisational structure of the entity, the Federation has, in all material respects, an adequate internal financial controls system with reference to financial statements and such internal financial controls with reference to financial statements were operating effectively as at 31st March 2026, based on the internal control with reference to financial statements criteria established by the Federation considering the essential components of internal control stated in the Guidance Note on Audit of Internal Financial Controls over financial reporting issued by the Institute of Chartered Accountants of India.
 - (g) With respect to other matters to be included in the Auditors' Report in accordance with the requirements of Section 197(16) of the Act as amended.

 - i. The Federation does not have any pending litigations which would impact its financial position

NOTE 1

A) SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

- 1) **Method of Accounting:** The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with Generally Accepted Accounting Principles (GAAP) in India, the Accounting Standards as prescribed under Section 133 of the Companies Act, 2013 read with Rule 7 of Companies (Accounts) Rules, 2014 and the relevant provisions of the Companies Act, 2013 and are based on the historical cost convention on accrual basis.
- 2) **Use of Estimates:** The preparation of the financial statements is in conformity with Generally Accepted accounting Principles in India (“Indian GAAP”) requires the management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities, disclosures relating to contingent assets and contingent liabilities as at the date of the financial statements, and the reported amounts of income and expenditure during the year.

Although these estimates are based on management’s best knowledge of current events and actions, actual results may differ from those estimates. Any revision to accounting estimates is recognized prospectively in the period in which the estimates are revised and in future periods affected thereby.

- 3) **Property, Plant and Equipment:** Property, Plant and Equipment are stated at cost of acquisition or construction less depreciation. Depreciation on Fixed Assets is provided using the Straight Line Method based on useful life of the assets as prescribed in Schedule II to the Companies Act, 2013. The cost of Property, Plant and Equipment not ready for intended use is disclosed under Capital Work in Progress.

4) **Employee Benefits:**

Group Gratuity: The Federation contributes to a Group Gratuity Policy with the Life Insurance Corporation of India for future payments of retirement gratuity to eligible employees other than consultants.

EDLI: The Federation contributes to an Employee Deposit Linked Insurance Scheme (EDLI) with the Life Insurance Corporation of India.

Interest Income: Interest Income is recognized on time proportion basis taking into account the accrued amount certified by the bank.

Recognition of Sponsorships: Sponsorships for Seminars and Conferences from the Corporates/Donors is recognized, where there is reasonable assurance that the Federation will comply with the conditions attached to them and where the related obligations have been fulfilled by the Federation and it is reasonably certain that ultimate collection of the sponsorship will be made.

- 6) **Earnings per share:** Earnings per share is not applicable as no shares were issued by the Federation.
- 7) **Provisions and Contingent Liabilities:** A provision is recognized when the Federation has a present obligation as a result of past events and it is probable that an outflow of resources will be required to settle the obligation in respect to which a reliable estimate can be made. Provisions are not discounted to its present value and are determined based on the best estimate required to settle the obligation at the balance sheet date. These are reviewed at each balance sheet date and adjusted to reflect the current best estimates.

A contingent liability is a liability that may occur, depending on the outcome of an uncertain future event. A liability is recorded in the accounting records if the liability is probable and can be reasonably estimated. If both of these conditions are not met, the liability may be disclosed in the notes to Financial Statements. Contingent Assets are neither recognized nor disclosed in the financial statements.

- 7) **Taxes on Income:** Provision for current tax has been made on taxable income arising on service activities. Provision for deferred tax is not considered as reported and taxable profit are same due to the income tax exemption available on other income.

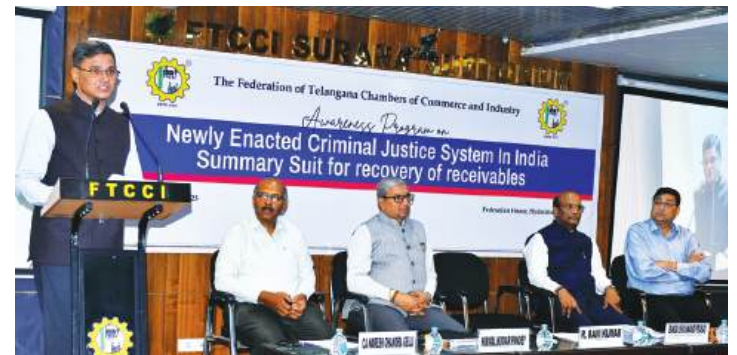

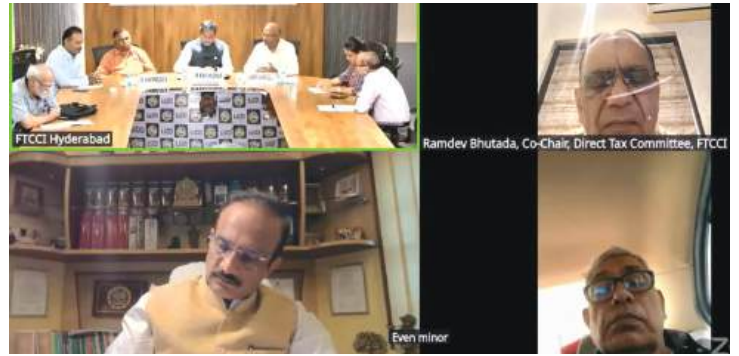
