**Subject: Registration of gig and platform workers on e-Shram portal of the Ministry of Labour & Employment - regarding.**

**Madam/Sir,**

The Ministry of Labour & Employment is continuously working to improve the life and dignity of labour force in the country by protecting and safeguarding the interest of workers, promoting welfare and providing social security to the labour force both in the organized and unorganized sectors. The Platform economy is an emerging sector both in India and globally, and has become an important source of employment generation in recent years.

2. The Ministry of Labour & Employment had launched the eShram portal on 26th August 2021 to register and support the unorganised/migrant workers of the country by providing them with a Universal Account Number (UAN) that helps in skilling, finding jobs and checking their eligibility for different social sector schemes being administered by Central and State Governments. The Ministry is making the portal as 'One-Stop-Solution' for the workers on a mission mode to help them access various social security schemes all in one place therefore, making it easier for them to identify their eligibility and avail the benefits they are entitled to.
3. Considering that millions of workforce are now joining the Platform economy, the Central Government is embracing this transformation and the Ministry of Labour & Employment is in the process of on-boarding the Platform Aggregators on e-Shram as well to facilitate registration of platform workers on the portal. In this regard, testing with few Aggregators has also been completed with their cooperation and proactive approach to ensure API integration with e-Shram portal. It is worthwhile to on-board and register the platform workers on e-Shram as it will provide them access to various welfare schemes and bring this large work force under the social security net. Aggregators play a vital role in on-boarding Platform workers on the portal, to ensure complete coverage with verified data base of the work force.
4. In view of the foregoing, and as foremost immediate requirement, the Aggregators are encouraged to come forward and complete the API testing in time-bound manner and 'on-board' themselves as well as the platform workers engaged by them on e-Shram portal of this Ministry.
5. To aid in this process, the suggested general terms are outlined and placed in **Annexure I**, along with the steps for registration of Aggregators and Platform workers in form of a Standard Operating Procedure (SOP) that is placed in **Annexure-II**. Further, for better coordination and policy decision, information pertaining to the Platform and Platform workers may also be shared during on boarding as per proforma placed in **Annexure-III**.
6. So far, the Aggregators and Platform workers have been supporting this initiative and the Ministry wishes to continue advancing in a collaborative manner. To give it a big push and take this endeavor to a logical conclusion in a time-bound manner, it is requested to extend your support in this regard by ensuring the registration of your platform workers on e-Shram portal of this Ministry to achieve a just and equitable gig and platform economy.
7. This issues with the approval of the competent authority.

#### **ORDER:**

As per the National Sample Survey estimate of 2015, there are about 26 lakh MSMEs in the State of Telangana. 8.6 lakh MSMEs have received UDYAM Registration since 2020. 22000 approvals for new MSMEs have been issued under the TGiPASS regulation since 2014.

2. Telangana's MSME Sector has shown significant growth and resilience. MSMEs in Telangana have shown a positive trend of formalization as annual registrations on the TGiPASS portal have increased by 11 – 15% annually since 2014. MSMEs have seen a rise in average investment from Rs 1 Crore in 2018 to Rs 2.15 Crore in 2022. Telangana also registers strong social and gender diversity among MSME owners compared to other States.
3. Despite their impressive performance, MSMEs in Telangana continue to face challenges with formalizing and graduating in size over time. As per estimates by NSSO, 65.7% of all MSMEs in the state are yet to be formalized. Further, TG-iPass data shows that Telangana continues to have a limited number of medium-sized enterprises. Between 2016 to 2023, medium-sized enterprises constituted only 2.9% of all manufacturing MSMEs and 3.5% of all service MSMEs registered on the TG-iPASS portal.
4. This MSME Policy is prepared by a consultative process with the MSME representative bodies and stake-holder consultation from Government, Industry and Research Organizations. 15 documents reviewed including submissions by industry, external consultants, government surveys, and MSME policies of other states

#### **I. This MSME Policy is designed to achieve the following Targets**

##### **Impact of proposed Policy:**

- 10% increase in MSME contribution to GSDP
- 15% year on year growth in MSME registered in TGiPASS

##### **Expected Outcomes of the Policy:**

- Inclusive employment
- Equitable growth
- Technology modernization
- Improved productivity

##### **Indicators:**

- 20% increase in jobs in MSMEs (30% of this is from SC/ST+ Women workers)
- Increase in MSMEs by 20% in Districts which currently have less than 10% of total MSMEs
- 10% increase in average capital investment for Micro, Small and Medium unit
- 10% increase in GVA contribution
- 10% of MSMEs graduate to next category.

#### **II. Challenges Faced by MSMEs**

1. **Land:** Affordability challenges, Low supply of industrial plots, Zoning restricts supply of land

2. **Finance:** Working capital stress, Collateral commitments, High demand of credit not met
3. **Raw materials:** availability of raw materials, Demand for local testing centres, Availability of Storage facilities (Warehousing)
4. **Labour:** Access to skilled labour, Retaining migrant worker, Female labour participation
5. **Technology:** Sub-optimal tech systems, High cost of tech, Low Adoption of digital solutions
6. **Markets:** Low awareness on export requirements, Quality certifications, Leveraging e-comm platforms

#### **III. Solutions Proposed**

The policy proposes the following measures:

##### **1. Increasing the availability, accessibility, and affordability of land:**

The Government of Telangana is committed to developing centers of MSME growth across the state. Creating industrial parks for MSMEs:

- 10 industrial parks between ORR-RRR, 5 dedicated to MSMEs
- o 1 park reserved for women-owned MSMEs and innovative startups each
- 5% plots reserved for women and 15% plots reserved for SC/ST entrepreneurs
