GOODBYE TO PIN CODE

Postal Department introduces DigiPIN, how to find your digital address?



The era of PIN codes, which were the attraction of postal addresses, is over, and the Indian Postal Department has introduced a digital address called 'DigiPIN' as an alternative. DIGIPIN will be the new address system in the country from now on. While traditional PIN codes cover a wide area, the 10-digit DigiPIN system represents the exact location of your home or business. Let's know what are the differences between PIN code and DigiPIN.

The Indian Postal Department has introduced the DIGIPIN system to understand the exact location. DigiPIN has a 10-digit digital code. Instead of the traditional pin code, which covered a wide area, the DigiPIN will provide precise location information. That is, the exact location of your home or business can be found through this DigiPIN. You can find your home by visiting the government website designated for creating a DigiPIN and finding the code. The advantage of DigiPIN is that it will deliver correspondence to the right place and help emergency services such as ambulances and fire departments to reach it accurately by understanding the location. It is hoped that DigiPIN will be beneficial in remote areas including rural areas.

It is claimed that DigiPIN will be able to deliver parcels to the right location not only for correspondence, but also for e-commerce websites.

How to find your DigiPIN?

The Government website

<https://dac.indiapost.gov.in/mydigipin/home>

has been prepared to find your DigiPIN. By visiting this website and clicking on the location you have found, you can find out your 10-digit DigiPIN. What makes DigiPIN different from other address systems is that you can know your exact location within a radius of four meters. India Post has developed a geocoded digital address system called DigiPIN in collaboration with IIT Hyderabad, NRSC and ISRO. DigiPIN can also be used offline.

Subject: Port restriction on import of certain goods from Bangladesh to India - Insertion of a new Para 19 under 'General Notes Regarding Import Policy under ITC (HS), 2022 Schedule 1 (Import Policy)

S.O.(E). In exercise of powers conferred by section 3 read with Section 5 of Foreign Trade (Development & Regulation) Act, 1992, read with paragraph 1.02 and 2.01 of the Foreign Trade Policy (FTP) 2023, as amended from time to time, the Central Government hereby introduces a new Para 19 to General Notes regarding Import Policy under ITC (HS), 2022 Schedule 1 (Import Policy) with immediate effect.

“19. The import of following goods from Bangladesh to India shall be regulated as under:

1. Port Restriction on import of Goods from Bangladesh

S.No.	Item Description	Import Policy / Port restrictions
(i)	All HS codes of Ready Made Garments (RMG)	Import from Bangladesh Shall not be allowed from any land port, however, it is allowed only through Nhava Sheva and Kolkata seaports
(ii)	Fruits/Fruits flavoured and Carbonated Drinks	Imports from Bangladesh shall not be allowed through any LCSs/ICPs in Assam, Meghalaya; Tripura and Mizoram; and LCS Changrabandha and Fulbari, in West Bengal
(iii)	Processed food items (Baked goods, Snacks, Chips and Confectionery	
(iv)	Cotton and Cotton Yarn Waste	
(v)	Plastic and PVC finished goods except pigments, dyes, plasticisers and granules that from input for own industries.	
(vi)	Wooden Furniture.	

2. The above restrictions at Para 1 shall not apply to import of Fish, LPG, Edible, Oil, and Crushed stone to India from Bangladesh

3. The above restrictions at Para 1 shall also not apply to Bangladesh export to Nepal/Bhutan transiting through India

Effect of the Notification:

A new Para 19 is introduced in 'General Notes Regarding Import Policy' under ITC (HS), 2022 Schedule 1 (Import Policy) regulating the Import of certain goods from Bangladesh to India, with immediate effect.

Subject: Removal of Port Restrictions and Testing Requirements for Export of Finished Leather, Wet Blue Leather, El Tanned Leather and Crust Leather -regarding.

S.0 (E): In exercise of the powers conferred by Section 3 read with Section 5 of the Foreign Trade (Development & Regulation) Act 1992, read with Para 1.02 and 2.01 of the Foreign Trade Policy 2023, as amended from time to time, the Central Government hereby rescinds Public Notice 23(RE-2013)/2009-14 dated August 13, 2013, as amended, from time to time. Accordingly, the following export conditions are revoked with immediate effect -

- i) Port restrictions on export of Finished Leather, Wet Blue Leather and El tanned leather.
- ii) Requirement for Testing and certification by Central Leather Research Institute (CLRI) for Finished Leather, Wet Blue Leather, Crust Leather and El tanned leather.

Effect of the Notification: The notification removes, with immediate effect, port restrictions on the export of Finished Leather, Wet Blue Leather, and El Tanned Leather, and the requirement of drawl of samples for testing, testing and certification by the Central Leather Research Institute (CLRI) for export of Finished Leather, Wet Blue Leather, Crust Leather, and El Tanned Leather.
